



Tenure-Track Faculty Position in Graphic & Publications Design

Franklin College invites applications for a tenure-track position at the Assistant Professor level in in graphic/publication/web design to begin in August 2019. We provide a strong, active, and tailored liberal arts education through small class sizes and intentional relationships between students and their faculty mentors. Located about 20 miles from downtown Indianapolis, we support purposeful and practical academic experiences in and out of the classroom that leverage this location as students pursue personal, intellectual and professional growth. This position will be shared between the Art Department and the Pulliam School of Journalism. This new hire will join the departments and the college at a time of exciting change. The historically strong Art and Pulliam School of Journalism programs are committed to delivering fundamentals needed in the market today through increasingly immersive and hands-on methods of teaching and learning. The College is implementing a similar initiative campus-wide.

Primary responsibilities include teaching courses in graphic design within the Art Department, as well as web and publication design within the Pulliam School of Journalism. Additional responsibilities include, but are not limited to: assisting with art shows, lectures and other art and journalism-related events on campus, consulting with web master, completing in-house design projects for Art and Journalism departments, and coordinating and supervising art and journalism majors completing design internships. This faculty member will also serve as academic advisor for students from both departments.

Candidates with superb design and communication skills who can demonstrate a dedication to teaching, the ability to contribute in meaningful ways to the College's continuing commitment to diversity, and a genuine interest in working with undergraduates in a small-college liberal arts setting will be given preference. Franklin College seeks a team player who understands how media work, has a commitment to lifelong learning, and is determined to achieve excellence. MFA or MA in design is preferred. Candidates must have either experience in commercial art or graphic design for news or public relations outlets. Candidates lacking commercial art or journalism/public relations design experience will be expected to demonstrate a willingness to seek further education in the area. College-level teaching experience is preferred.



Evaluation of applications will begin October 1, 2018 and will continue until the position is filled. A complete application will include letter of application, vita, transcripts, five work samples in digital format, a statement of teaching philosophy and three current letters of recommendation.
