- B. Apply for jobs and internships on www.LinkedIN.com .
- C. Apply for internships on www.Indianaintern.net .
- D. Set up a virtual meeting with an Ascend representative at <a href="http://bit.ly/FCAscend">http://bit.ly/FCAscend</a> so they can help connect with open jobs and internships and get you into their system. They are doing all intake meetings by phone.

- A. Build your connections on LinkedIn and then connect through messaging or e-mail
- B. Set up Zoom or other on-line video chats with connections. Pick their brains about what they like and don't like about their jobs. Find out what they consider to be the BEST path is within their field to find employment opportunities.
- C. Join groups on LinkedIn and then read postings and participate in discussions within that group.
- D. Join professional groups in your field. Many offer student rates.
