Pulliam Journalism Scholarship Deadline: Nov. 15	By invitation only. GPA 3.0+ Essay required	One full tuition scholarship
Academic Merit Scholarships Priority Deadline: Dec. 1	Scholarship amounts are based on GPA	Up to \$20,000
Fine Arts (Audition/Portfolio) Deadline: April 1	Students interested in music, art or theatre Audition or portfolio required	\$500 – \$1,000
Alumni	Students with parent, grandparent or sibling who graduated from Franklin College	\$2,000
