## 2023-2024 Professional Judgment Appeal (General)

\_\_\_\_\_ **Medical or dental expenses** – Paid out-of-pocket medical or dental expenses not covered by insurance that exceeds 10% of your income during 2022.

  - Copies of canceled checks used to pay out-of-pocket medical or dental expenses **AND/OR**
  - Confirmation of **out-of-pocket amount paid by you** during 2022 and purpose of expense. Amounts not paid cannot be considered.
