APPLY AT ANY TIME

Franklin College offers rolling admission, and our online application is free all year.

- Complete the online application at FranklinCollege.edu/apply or use CommonApp.org.
- 2. Provide the appropriate transcripts to the Franklin College Office of Admissions, 101 Branigin Blvd., Franklin, IN 46131 or admissions@FranklinCollege.edu:

High School Transcripts: Request from your high school guidance office or **www.Parchment.com**. If you receive the transcript, do not open it. Place it in a larger envelope and forward to Franklin College Office of Admissions by U.S. Mail. Transcripts need to come directly from Parchment or your high school to be considered official. If you have completed more than 24 credit hours of college credit, then you do not need to submit a high school transcript.

College Transcripts: Request from your registrar's webpage or **www.Parchment**. **com**. Again, transcripts need to come directly from Parchment or your previous institution(s) to be considered official.



TRANSFER CREDITS

You can get an overview of how your courses will transfer by using the QR code or going to **www.Transferology.com**. Once you apply, the Franklin College Office of Academic Records can evaluate your courses and let you know exactly what transfers and how each course counts towards Franklin's requirements.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL AID

A Transfer Award is given to transfer students based upon their academic achievements at their previous institution. These awards range from \$10,000 to \$15,000 per school year and will automatically renew as long as the student remains in good academic standing.

IVY TECH ASAP STUDENTS

Ivy Tech students who have earned an **associate of science degree in the Associate Accelerated Program (ASAP) in a liberal arts cohort** can easily transfer their credits to Franklin College and complete a bachelor of arts degree in two years. ASAP students are guaranteed admission to Franklin College and receive an extra \$1,500 per year.

According to the provisions of the Guaranteed Admission Articulation Agreement between Ivy Tech and Franklin College, students who study these majors are able to complete their bachelor's degree in two years:

- Additional programs are available at Franklin for completion over a 2.5 year or 3-year span.
- Applying for admission to Franklin College is free and depositing to secure registration is \$200. There is no additional cost to transfer to Franklin College from Ivy Tech.
- When IVY Tech ASAP students transfer to Franklin College, they will be awarded no less than 60 hours
 of transfer credit toward their bachelor of arts degree and will be required to complete an additional
 sixty credit hours at Franklin to complete the degree. Students must also meet Franklin College's
 minimum grade point requirements for specific courses.
- Ivy Tech students who want to take advantage of this opportunity can work with their Ivy Tech academic advisers to confirm that their academic plan meets all the requirements.
- Students can further maximize savings on their degree by taking advantage of scholarships and requirements at both institutions. At Ivy Tech, 43% of students receive financial aid; at Franklin College, 99% of students receive financial aid.
