Scholarships – The art department awards scholarships up to \$5000 to students based on the quality of their portfolio. These scholarships are renewable annually for up to 4 years based on continued performance as an art major and are in addition to other financial aid and/or scholarships received.

In the name of the image please use the following format: Your last name, the medium of the piece and size (in inches). For example: Cunningham_Oil on canvas_18x24.jpg.
