

Assistant or Associate Professor of Biology (Tenure-Track)

Do you want to teach, mentor undergraduate research, and make an impact on students? Franklin College invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track position at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor of Biology to begin August of 2024. Candidates with leadership experience in pre-medical studies will be considered for the Deppe Endowed Chair, but emerging leaders are also encouraged to apply. The ideal candidate has expertise in Anatomy and Physiology with a strong commitment to teaching. Teaching responsibilities are 12 credit hours each semester, plus one 3-week intensive January term course every three years. Candidates with an interest in mentoring undergraduate research and pre-medical program development are particularly encouraged to apply. Located about 20 miles from downtown Indianapolis, Franklin College is a private, four-year small liberal arts college that provides a strong, active, and tailored liberal arts education through small class sizes and intentional relationships between students and faculty mentors. Required Qualifications:

- Ph.D. or ABD status in a Biological Science. Ph.D. must be complete before tenure can be granted;
- Passion for teaching and mentorship of students in research, internships, professional development settings;
- An understanding of student development in the context of a small, collegial liberal arts setting that emphasizes student-faculty interaction;
- Ability to teach Human Anatomy & Physiology and Animal Physiology;
- Ability to provide broad service to the College, such as academic advising and committee work.

Preferred Qualifications:

- A desire to lead and grow our pre-medical program;
- Skill in developing and stewarding external partners (i.e., internship hosts);
- At least two years of college teaching experience (including meaningful graduate student roles);
- Ability to contribute meaningfully to the College's commitment to diversity;
- A record of meaningful scientific research and an understanding of undergraduate research at a small liberal arts college.

Applications that are complete by October 13, 2023 will receive full consideration; review of applications will continue until the position is filled.
